From United Way East Ontario's environmental scan, [The Employment Gap for Indigenous Youth in Eastern Ontario](#), we learned about the importance of creating safe, culturally sensitive places of employment when attempting to successfully recruit Indigenous youth. Ensuring cultural safety is key in fostering supportive environments and relationships. It goes beyond cultural awareness (acknowledgement of one's own and other cultures), cultural sensitivity (accepting of other difference), and cultural competence (using academic, experiential, and interpersonal skills to understand difference). Cultural safety also involves a component of self-reflection to recognize our own cultural lens and develop empathy and advocacy to move towards understanding and positive change. Below you will find a list of Indigenous online learning resources that you can use to begin your journey toward creating a culturally safe and sensitive work environment that will not only attract Indigenous youth but also ensure their successful retention.
